COMMUNITY PREPAREDNESS IS THE KEY PRIORITY


Effective community preparedness occurs at all levels including:

WHAT IS NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH/BLOCK WATCH?

- 1.) Citizens and Police working in partnership to reduce crimes and improve the quality of life in neighborhoods.
 - Reporting suspicious activity.
- 2.) A cohesive body of citizens addressing issues which concern the entire community.
- 3.) Neighbors getting to know each other, taking the time to care about each other and working together in a program of mutual assistance.

WHAT NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH/BLOCK WATCH IS NOT

- 1.) Not guard duty, Not vigilantes, Not to take the place of Law Enforcement.
 - Your safety is top priority.
 - Report suspicious activity

HOW TO MAKE IT HAPPEN

- 1.) Pick a block Captain
Organize the neighbors
Encourage participation

- 2.) Have first meeting/make it fun
Ukiah Police Department will provide training at your first meeting. Subjects will cover:
Recognizing and reporting suspicious activity,
Crime prevention techniques,
CPTED for sites, etc.

- 3.) Ways to communicate with neighbors
 - Email
 - Cell phone

 - Person to Person

MAP YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD

- Neighborhood Disaster Readiness
- Nine steps to take immediately after a disaster
 - It is hard to think clearly following disaster.

MAP YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD

- Find out the skills and equipment each neighbor has that are useful after disaster strikes.
 - Knowing which neighbors have supplies and skills aids your response and allows everyone to help in a meaningful way.

MAP YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD

- Create a Neighborhood Map showing the locations of:
 - Each natural gas meter and propane tank.
 - About 67% of house fires following disasters are caused by leaking gas. Knowing where these meters are and shutting them off helps prevent fires.
 - Each neighbor who is elderly, those with a disability, or homes where children may be unattended during certain hours of the day.
 - Checking on neighbors prone to injury helps protect them.

Office of Emergency Management

The City of Ukiah City Manager's Office coordinates the emergency management and disaster preparedness program for the City by working with the Office of Emergency Management, Fire and Police departments, city staff, partner agencies, businesses, and citizens to minimize risk by actively seeking to mitigate hazards, to prepare for, respond to, and successfully recover from natural or man-made disasters when they strike.

Be Prepared, Plan in Advance of a Disaster

The City of Ukiah is vulnerable to both natural and man-made disasters including earthquakes, fires, and floods. As a city our most important responsibility is to protect the public and ensure that everyone is ready to respond to and recover from potential disasters.

All residents, local employees and visitors are encouraged to take actions to improve their individual preparedness. In a major disaster, resources will be spread thin, leading to potential delays in delivering help. Citizens can equip and educate themselves in the event a disaster occurs by being prepared.
